Role Purpose

To work with relevant staff from the Quantock Hills National Landscape Team, farmers/landowners, and local authority partners to develop and deliver projects/schemes that will enhance and restore the landscape and natural heritage of the Quantock Hills National Landscape.

To administer discretionary grant schemes, such as the Greater Quantock Landscape Development Fund (GQLDF) and Farming in Protected Landscapes Programme (FiPL), which includes supporting applicants to write applications, assessing applications against agreed criteria and undertaking progress monitoring and evaluation of projects.

To deliver landscape and natural heritage workstreams by developing projects, delivering schemes of work, and managing contracts that will undertake land management activities such as invasive species control, scrub clearance, planting schemes and habitat restoration.

Liaise with other National Landscape staff, local authority partners, landowners, and statutory agencies as appropriate to develop projects and schemes of work related to the natural heritage.

Work closely with AONB colleagues to develop, co-ordinate and implement the landscape and natural heritage workstream and forge links with local communities, landowners, and interest groups.
