As the Lead Traffic Control Engineer, the job holder has responsibility, under the overall direction of the Service Manager – Traffic Control for the successful management of the Traffic Control Assets and the associated infrastructure, to manage and improve the existing County Highway Network improving safety and facilitating appropriate use/access. This role enables elements of the Council Plan in enabling a greener, more sustainable, flourishing, and resilient Somerset.

Lead Expert	• Oversee, the health and safety management of the team, and ensure the current Construction Design and Management regulations are applied to schemes as necessary. Advise project team members of their responsibilities in this area
Customer champion	 Support and oversee statistical analyses (e.g., fault repair status, condition of installations, value of equipment) for input to capital, PFI and Medium-Term Financial Plan bids and reports associated with them. Use analysis to monitor Term Maintenance Contractors performance and for asset management

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Dimensions of role

The jobholder is required to maintain a high profile in dealing with often complex, contentious or controversial situations, relating to traffic issues. The nature of the work involves a substantial amount of contact with the following:

- Senior Leadership Team, Officers from the other departments.
- Deputise for Service Manager Traffic Control as required.
- Elected members of the Council to provide professional advice, or, discuss issues related to the service.
- Directors and managers of the service provider concerning operational issues.
- Contact with the media on operational issues.
- Frequent contact with the public/police over many traffic related issues.

• In the event of claims against the Council, relating to the job holder's area of responsibility, may be required to represent the Authority in Court. This will include attendance, presenting evidence and contributing to preparation of documentation.

The nature of the work involves contact with the following:

- Elected members of the County, and Parish / Town Councils to provide professional advice and/or discuss issues related to the service.
- Managers/engineers concerning scheme implementation issues.
- Managers and professionals within the County Council, other authorities, and agencies. For the purposes of liaison, negotiation, information gathering, comparing performance etc.
- Civil and control system contractors involved with the implementation, commissioning, and maintenance of the installations/systems.

Responsible for the day to day running of more than 280 traffic signal installations, CCTV cameras, Variable Message Signs, Variable Speed Signs and Vehicle Actuated Signs. All the above dispersed across Somerset and with a capital replacement value of over £30 million.

Oversee individual schemes and technical works to support the Service Manager in the spending of the annual revenue budget of approximately £750,000 on proactive and reactive maintenance works; and approximately £2.500,000 of capital funding.

The job holder has direct management for up to 6 Traffic Control Engineers and technicians.
